"Supplemental Education Services"***

What are Supplemental Education Services?

The term "Supplemental Education Services" refers to extra help or tutoring in school subjects, such as reading, language arts and math. These services are free of charge as a part of the Federal Program "No Child Left Behind". Children can receive tutoring in-home, at public locations or at the child's school.

Who can get these Services?

Students who are signed up for the free and reduced lunch program and attend a Program Improvement School. *(All foster youth and children in relative care qualify for the Free and Reduced Lunch Program, but must be signed up annually).* Ask at the child's school if that school has been identified as a Program Improvement School or call the school's district office. If the school does not offer SES tutoring ask about afterschool homework help often provided by outside agencies at very low cost to the families.

When and how can I sign up my child for tutoring?

Each school's district has their own deadlines and sign up dates. Always check with the school and/ or the district office as to when and how you can sign up your child. All schools and districts will provide the parent(s) with a list of tutoring agencies, also known as "Providers", who have been approved by the state. The parent should choose a provider who best meets their needs, as to location or hours of the day.
