Head Start is a part-day (3½ hours) or full-day (six plus hours) comprehensive child development program for low-income preschoolers ages three to five years old. Early Head Start and Head Start also provide and link families with social services, health, mental health, disabilities, and nutrition services and have strong parent engagement components. Early Head Start and Head Start services are free. LACOE operates the largest Head Start/Early Head Start-State Preschool program in the nation. In addition to LACOE, a number of other school districts and organizations offer Early Head Start and Head Start programs.
