APRIL 28, 2009 AMENDMENT TO ITEM NO. 24: KATIE A. STRATEGIC PLAN, TRI-ANNUAL REPORT ON THE MENTAL HEALTH SCREENING PROCESS

On April 28, 2009, the Board ordered the Chief Executive Officer (CEO), the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) and the Department of Mental Health (DMH) to prepare a monthly report on the mental health screening process. On January 19, 2010, the Board ordered the CEO, DCFS and DMH to report on how to reduce the time between mental health screening and the start of mental health services. In response, DCFS and DMH reviewed a sample of children's cases and on March 16, 2010 provided the Board with a plan that resulted in a redesign of the Coordinated Services Action Team (CSAT) and Referral Tracking System (RTS). On April 17, 2012, the Board Deputies approved the current format of the report and agreed that the report, dated April 30, 2012, would be the last monthly report and, going forward, the report will be submitted every four months on August 30, 2013, December 31, 2013 and April 30, 2014.

This is the third tri-annual report updating your Board on the redesign of the CSAT implemented on October 1, 2010 and providing progress of all Service Planning Areas (SPAs) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2012 – FY 2013 thus far (July 1, 2012 through February 28, 2013).

CSAT Process

The CSAT process (Attachment 1) requires expedited screening and response times based upon the acuity of a child's need for mental health services. Additionally, the CSAT process provides for the annual screening of children in existing cases with previous negative screens. Four tracks establish the process by which all DCFS children in new and currently open cases are screened and referred for mental health services.

Track	Screening Process
Track 1	Children in newly opened cases who are detained and placed in out-of-home care receive a mental health screening at case opening.
Track 2	Children in newly opened cases under Voluntary Family Maintenance, Voluntary Family Reunification or Court-supervised Family Maintenance case plans are screened at case opening.
Track 3	Children in existing cases opened before CSAT implementation are screened at the next case plan update.
Annual	Children in existing cases are screened 12 months after previously screening negative.

Referral Tracking System (RTS)

The RTS Summary Data Report (Attachment 2) includes 22 data elements providing the rate, number, timeliness, and acuity of mental health screenings, referral, and service response times to DCFS children in new and existing cases on a point-in-time basis.

The RTS Summary Data Report as of April 17, 2013 provides the progress of all SPAs for FY 2012 – FY 2013, from July 1, 2012 through February 28, 2013. This report reflects CSAT performance completed through April 17, 2013 and is a snapshot of work in progress. The following two charts depict the results to date for all three tracks associated with the screening and referral process:

Chart I shows that of 15,019 children, 14,583 children required screens. (15,019 minus those currently receiving mental health services [308¹], in closed cases [312], who ran away or were abducted [48]):

- 12,111 (83.05%) children screened positive of all children requiring screens (14,583);
- 2,209 (15.15%) children screened negative of all children requiring screens (14,583);
- 263 (1.80%) children have screens pending of all children requiring screens (14,583).





Chart II shows that of the 12,111 children who screened positive:

- 3 (0.03%) children were determined to have acute needs;
- 130 (1.07%) children were determined to have urgent needs;
- 11,050 (91.24%) children were determined to have routine needs;
- 928 (7.66%) children's acuity level was pending determination and/or data entry.

¹ The total number of children in all tracks currently receiving mental health services is 308. However, only children in existing cases (track 3 [76]) are subtracted from the total number of children requiring screens because all children in new cases (track 1 [29] and track 2 [203]) must be screened whether or not they are already receiving mental health services.



Acuity Referral Standards

Acute	Children presenting with acute needs are referred for mental health services on the same day as screening.
Urgent	Children presenting with urgent needs are referred for mental health services within one day of screening.
Routine	Children presenting with routine needs are referred for mental health services within 10 days of screening.

The average number of days between screening and referral to DMH for mental health services according to acuity for FY 2012-2013 as of April 17, 2013:

- Children with acute needs were referred to DMH in 2 days on average.
- Children with urgent needs were referred to DMH in 2 days on average.
- Children with routine needs were referred to DMH in 5 days on average.

Mental Health Service Activity Standards

Acute	Children presenting with acute needs begin receiving mental health service activities on the same day as the referral.
Urgent	Children presenting with urgent needs begin receiving mental health service activities within no more than three days of the referral.
Routine	Children presenting with routine needs begin receiving mental health service activities within no more than thirty days of the referral.

The average number of days between referral to and receipt of a mental health activity according to acuity in FY 2012-2013 as of April 17, 2013:

- The average number of days for receipt of a mental health service activity was 0 days for children with acute needs. (Attachment 2, line 19a);
- The average number of days for receipt of a mental health service activity was 1 day for children with urgent needs (Attachment 2, line 19b); and
- The average number of days for receipt of a mental health service activity was 1 day for children with routine needs (Attachment 2, line 19c).

The rate of children that received a mental health activity with required timeframes according to acuity in FY 2012-2013 as of April 17, 2013:

- 100 percent of children with acute needs received DMH services on the same day as the referral (Attachment 2, line 20a);
- 92.31 percent of children with urgent needs received DMH services within 3 days of the referral (Attachment 2, line 20b); and
- 96.56 percent of children with routine needs received DMH services within 30 days of the referral (Attachment 2, line 20c).

Achievements

As of April 17, 2013, for children served in FY 2012-2013 thus far, the average timeline from case opening/case plan update to the start of mental health service activities is 9 days.

DCFS and DMH continue to see improvements in mental health screening, assessment and service delivery:

- 98.20 percent of children who were eligible for screening were screened for mental health needs;

- 97.41 percent of children who screened positive were referred to mental health services; and
- 94.01 percent of children referred for services received mental health service activities within the required timelines.

Quality Service Review

The Quality Service Review (QSR) process is the central strategy adopted by the County, in collaboration with the Katie A. Advisory Panel and plaintiff attorneys, to assess the quality of the services delivered to members of the Katie A. class. The QSR is an action-oriented learning process used to improve practice and service delivery for children and families. The QSR is also a measure of how well DCFS is implementing the Core Practice Model, the primary framework for practice expectations. Findings from case reviews are used to guide next steps to support practice and enhancing efforts that will lead to better outcomes for the families served.

The QSR measures both systems performance and outcomes for children and families. It reflects the quality of services in such areas as family engagement, teaming among service providers, and children and families. As well as the ability to assess the needs that bring families to DCFS' attention, and provide timely and adequate services and supports. The QSR evaluates outcomes such as safety, permanency, well-being, school performance, and the ability to form appropriate social relationships.

Three DCFS offices have completed a second QSR. The following provides a sample of historical and the most recent QSR data results, narrative findings, and a QSR story. The focus is on those indicators that are most essential to improving the work. As a point of reference, the higher the scores achieved, the better the practice and outcomes. Benchmarks targeted for systems performance and child status are noted in the table below. Definitions of these indicators are found at the end of the following section.

Definition of Indicators:

INDICATOR	DEFINITION
Overall Child/Youth Status	The QSR Protocol provides ten qualitative indicators for measuring the current status of a focus child.
Overall Practice Performance	This measure is based on nine qualitative indicators measuring certain core practice functions being provided with and for the focus child and the child's parents and/or caregivers.
Engagement	Degree to which those working with the focus child and family are: Relating with the child/youth, biological family, extended family, primary caregiver, and other team members for the purpose of building a genuine, trusting and collaborative working relationship. Identifying a support system and/or finding family members who can assist with support and permanency for the focus child. Developing and maintaining a mutually beneficial trust-base working relationship with the child and family that involves having unconditional positive regard, respect for diversity, an inclusive planning process, and the ability to understand and work through resistance to participating in services. Focusing on the child and family's strengths and needs. Being receptive, dynamic, and willing to make adjustments in scheduling and meeting locations to accommodate family participation. Offering transportation and child care supports, where necessary, to increase family participation in planning and support efforts.
Teaming	Degree to which: (1) the "right people" for this child and family have formed a working Child and Family Team that meets, talks, and plans together. (2) The CFT has the skills, family knowledge, and abilities necessary to define the strengths and needs of this child and family and to organize effective service for this child and family, given the level of complexity of circumstances and cultural background of the child and family. (3) Members of the child and family's team collectively function as a unified team in planning services and evaluating results. (4) The decisions and actions of the team reflect a coherent pattern of effective teamwork and collaborative problem solving that builds upon child and family strengths and needs to benefit the child and family.
Long-term View	Degree to which: There are stated, shared, and understood safety, well-being, and permanency outcomes and functional life goals for the child and family that specify required protective capacities, desired behavior changes, sustainable supports, and other accomplishments necessary for the child and family to achieve and sustain adequate daily functioning and greater self-sufficiency.
Assessment	Degree to which those involved with the child and family understand: (1) Their strengths, needs, preferences, and underlying issues. (2) What must change for the child to function effectively in daily settings and activities and for the family to support and protect the child effectively. (3) What must change for the child/family to have better overall well-being and improved family functioning. (4) The "big picture" situation and dynamic factors impacting the child and family sufficiently to guide intervention. (5) The outcomes desired by the child and family from their involvement with the system. (6) The path and pace by which permanency will be achieved for a child who is not living with nor returning to the family of origin.
Intervention Services and Supports	Degree to which the strategies, supports, and services planned for the child, parent or caregiver, and family are available on a timely and adequate basis to meet near-term child and family needs and to achieve the outcomes planned.
Adequacy of Services and Supports	Degree to which planned interventions, services, and supports being provided to the child and family have <i>sufficient power</i> (precision, intensity, duration, fidelity, and consistency) and <i>beneficial effect</i> to produce results necessary to meet near-term needs and achieve outcomes that fulfill the long-term view.

Most Recent Office QSR Results:

The most recent QSR was conducted during March 2013 within the Compton DCFS Regional Office, Service Area 6. The key results are provided below:

Twelve randomly selected cases were reviewed in Compton and 75 percent scored in the acceptable range with respect to overall child/youth status. This was comparable to their previous baseline score. The cases scored 58 percent in the acceptable range with respect to overall practice performance. This score was 11 percentage points higher than the countywide baseline and 27 percentage points higher than their office's score during the first cycle. Three practice indicators were notably higher in Compton compared to the countywide average. On "Engagement," 75 percent of cases scored favorably (compared to 60 percent in the countywide baseline); on "Long Term View", 50 percent scored in the favorable range (compared to 39 percent in the countywide baseline); on "Adequacy of Intervention" 58 percent of the case scored favorably (compared to 52 percent in the countywide baseline). In addition, Compton improved their practice scores within their office during the second cycle when compared to their baseline cycle scores on the indicators of "Teamwork", 17% acceptable (compared to 0%), "Assessment", 42% acceptable (compared to 32%), and "Supports & Services" 58% acceptable (compared to 54%).

Compton's improved practice scores during the second cycle follow the positive trend seen in the first two SPA 7 Offices, Belvedere and Santa Fe Springs, where overall practice improved by 20% and 11% respectively, when compared against the countywide baseline.

The greatest improvements over the countywide baseline seem to be within two key practice indicators, which appear to be driving the overall positive results: "Engagement" and "Long Term View". (These two indicator scores improved by 20% and 16% respectively.) This means that staff within the system of care are developing positive rapport and effective working relationships with children/youth and families to bring them

in as full participants in case planning and goal accomplishment. It also means that staff within the system of care are creating better shared and understood safety, well-being, and permanency outcomes and functional life goals for the child and family that specify required protective capacities, desired behavioral changes, sustainable supports, and other accomplishments necessary for safe case closure.

The lagging practice indicator continues to be "Teamwork", which scores improved slightly within the Belvedere and Compton offices, 33% and 17% acceptable respectively. Better Teamwork improves the formation and function of the total support system (including the right informal as well as formal supports) around the family: to unite, communicate, and coordinate actions toward the case plan goals and following case closure.

A QSR Story

Six-year-old focus child's involvement with DCFS began following allegations of general neglect. During the investigation, the parents disclosed methamphetamine use within twenty-four hours prior to the CSW's initial contact. The focus child resided in out-of-home care and a short time before the QSR, returned home where she lives with her mother, younger sister and mother's boyfriend.

Mother completed a residential substance abuse program and drug testing as required by DCFS, and has been sober for nine months. The CSW referred the focus child for a Multi-disciplinary Assessment Team (MAT) assessment, and she was linked with a therapist at the same agency. The focus child has been receiving weekly, in-home therapy sessions with the same therapist for more than a year. The therapist is beginning to work with the focus child and her mother as they adjust to living together.

The CSW remains very much engaged with the family. She knows them well and understands their strengths and needs. The CSW continues to encourage mother in her recovery. All those interviewed agree that focus child has benefited from the MAT assessment, which helped to identify her strengths and needs. Reports indicate that the focus child is no longer feeling sad and has fewer tantrums. The therapy is helping her to develop positive coping skills and to understand the concept of family.

Summary

This is the third tri-annual report provided to your Board tracking mental health acuity and response rates since the redesign. CSAT processes, RTS business rules and programming, and the associated Summary Data Report are modified as lessons are learned. Modification of the Summary Data Report is currently underway to breakout performance on an annual basis, rather than cumulatively since implementation, to provide a more accurate picture of current practice and performance. Similarly, our practice and service delivery system is being refined through the QSR process. The FY 2012-2013

Summary Data Report and updated QSR results will be included with the August 30, 2013 tri-annual report to your Board.



Track #1: Newly Detained

All newly detained children eligible for the Multidisciplinary Assessment Team (MAT) program will receive a comprehensive assessment (including mental health) and mental health service linkage. All newly detained children not eligible for MAT, or in a SPA with insufficient capacity, will receive a mental health screening by the CSW using the Child Welfare Mental Health Screening Tool (MHST). Based on a positive mental health screening, children will be referred for mental health services through the co-located DMH staff and/or Service Linkage Specialist (SLS).

Track #2: Newly Open Non-Detained

All newly opened non-detained children (family maintenance or voluntary family reunification) will receive a mental health screening by the CSW using the MHST and, based on a positive mental health screening, referred for mental health services through the co-located DMH staff and/or SLS.

Track #3: Existing Open Cases

All existing open cases will receive a mental health screening by the CSW using the MHST when the next case plan update is due or a behavioral indicator is present (unless the child is already receiving mental health services) and, based on a positive mental health screening, referred for mental health services through the co-located DMH staff and/or SLS.

Total Initial Screens, Referrals & Activities

All children in tracks # 1, 2 and 3 will receive an initial MHST upon case opening and, based on a positive mental health screening, will be referred for mental health services through the co-located DMH staff and/or SLS.

Footnotes

- (1) Number of children is defined as the total number of children receiving DCFS services within each screening track.
- (2) Number of children currently receiving mental health services is the number of children in an existing DCFS case who are currently receiving mental health services, defined as having received a billable mental health service activity within the previous 60 calendar days. The number of children currently receiving mental health services in track one and two is provided for information purposes only. The number of children currently receiving mental health services in track three is provided to show the number of children who are not required to be screened.
- (3) Number of children requiring screens is defined as a) the number of newly detained children with a case opening in the month; b) the number of newly open non-detained children with a case opening in the month; c) the number of children in an existing open case, not currently receiving mental health services, with a case plan update due or a behavioral indicator identified requiring the completion of a MHST within the month. Additionally, the number of children requiring screens may be reduced by the number of children in cases that were closed or by the number of runaway/abducted children in the 30 day period.
 - (a) Number of children in cases that were closed within 30 days of case opening is the number of children whose cases were closed during the timeframe that screening should occur.
 - (b) Number of children that ran away or were abducted within 30 days of case opening is the number of children that ran away or were abducted during the timeframe that screening should occur.
- (4) Number of children screened is defined as the total number of DCFS children for whom a MHST completed.
- (5) Number of children pending screens is defined as the number of children for whom a MHST is required and have not received a screen.
- (6) Rate of screening is defined as the percent of children screened out of the total number required to be screened using a MHST.
- (7) Number of days between case opening/case plan due date and screen is defined as the average number of calendar days between the DCFS case opening date or case plan due date and the completion of a MHST.
- (8) Number of children with negative screens is defined as the number of children with negative screens out of total children screened.
- (9) Number of children with positive screens is defined as the total number of children with positive screens out of total children screened.
 - (a) Number of children screened acute is defined as the total number of children with positive screens and acute mental health needs.
 - (b) Number of children screened urgent is defined as the total number of children with positive screens and urgent mental health needs.
 - (c) Number of children screened routine is defined as the total number of children with positive screens and routine mental health needs.
- (10) Rate of children with positive screens is defined as the percent of children with positive screens out of the total number of children screened.
 - (a) Rate of acute screens is defined as the percent of children screened and determined to have acute mental health needs out of the total number of children with positive screens.
 - (b) Rate of urgent screens is defined as the percent of children screened and determined to have urgent mental health needs out of the total number of children with positive screens.
 - (c) Rate of routine screens is defined as the percent of children screened and determined to have routine mental health needs out of the total number of children with positive screens.
- (11) Number of children for whom consent for mental health services is declined is defined as the number of children for whom consent for mental health services is declined by the parent/legal guardian, the court, and/or a youth age 12 years and older.
- (12) Number of children with positive screens determined to be EPSDT-eligible is defined as the number of children identified to be in need of a mental health assessment determined to be insured through the Federal Medicaid, Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) program.
- (13) Number of children with positive screens determined to be privately insured is defined as the number of children identified to be in need of a mental health assessment and who are privately insured (Kaiser, Blue Cross, etc.).
- (14) Number of children referred for mental health services is defined as the number of children referred for mental health services through all DMH and non-DMH funded programs including MAT, Wraparound, DMH directly operated clinics, other DMH contracted providers, as well as services offered through private insurance, DCFS funded programs or any other type of appropriate mental health provider/program. Additionally, the number of children requiring referral for mental health services may be reduced by the number of children in cases that were closed, by the number of runaway/abducted children or by the number of children for whom consent for mental health services was denied in the 60 days period.
 - (a) Number of children in cases that were closed within 60 days of case opening is the number of children whose cases were closed during the timeframe that referral to mental health services should occur.
 - (b) Number of children that ran away or were abducted within 60 days of case opening is the number of children that ran away or were abducted during the timeframe that referral to mental health services should occur.
 - (c) Number of children for whom consent was declined within 60 days of case opening is the number of children with positive screens for whom consent for mental health services was declined during the timeframe that referral to mental health services should occur.
- (15) Number of days between screening and referral to mental health provider is defined as the average number of calendar days between a positive MHST.
 - (a) Number of days between children screening acute and referral to mental health provider is defined as the average number of calendar days between the day children are determined to have acute mental health needs and the referral to a mental health provider.
 - (b) Number of days between children screening urgent and referral to mental health provider is defined as the average number of calendar days between the day children are determined to have urgent mental health needs and the referral to a mental health provider.
 - (c) Number of days between children screening routine and referral to mental health provider is defined as the average number of calendar days between the day children are determined to have routine mental health needs and the referral to a mental health provider.
- (16) Total number of children referred to mental health services is defined as the number of children with a positive MHST.
 - (a) Total number of children with acute needs referred for mental health services is defined as the number of children with a positive screen that are referred to mental health services.
 - (b) Total number of children with urgent needs referred for mental health services is defined as the number of children with a positive screen determined to have urgent mental health needs that are referred for mental health services.
 - (c) Total number of children with routine needs referred for mental health services is defined as the number of children with a positive screen determined to have routine mental health needs that are referred for mental health services.
- (17) Rate of referral is defined as the percent of children referred to a mental health provider out of the total number with a positive MHST.
 - (a) Rate of referral of children with acute screens is defined as the percent of all children with acute screens referred to a mental health provider.
 - (b) Rate of referral of children with urgent screens is defined as the percent of all children with urgent screens referred to a mental health provider.
 - (c) Rate of referral of children with routine screens is defined as the percent of all children with routine screens referred to a mental health provider.
- (18) Number of children accessing services is defined as the number of children referred by DCFS, based upon a positive mental health screening, who subsequently receive a mental health service, including such services as assessment, treatment, case management, consultation, etc. Additionally, the number of children required to receive mental health services may be reduced by the number of children in cases that were closed, by the number of runaway/abducted children or by the number of children for whom consent for mental health services was revoked in the 90 days period.
- (19) Number of days between referral for mental health services and the provision of a mental health activity is defined as the average number of calendar days between referral for mental health services and the provision of a mental health service activity.
 - (a) Average number of days between referral and receipt of a mental health activity for children with acute needs is defined as the average number of calendar days between the day children are determined to have acute mental health needs and the provision of a mental health activity.
 - (b) Average number of days between referral and receipt of a mental health activity for children with urgent needs is defined as the average number of calendar days between the day children are determined to have urgent mental health needs and the provision of a mental health activity.
 - (c) Average number of days between referral and receipt of a mental health activity for children with routine needs is defined as the average number of calendar days between the day children are determined to have routine mental health needs and the provision of a mental health activity.
- (20) Rate of children that were screened for mental health needs and received a mental health activity within required timeframes is defined as the percent of children who received a mental health service activity within the required timeframe out of the total number of children referred.
 - (a) Rate of children with acute needs that received a mental health service activity on the same day as referral to mental health is defined as the percent of children with acute mental health needs out of all children with acute mental health needs who received a mental health service on the same calendar day as the referral.
 - (b) Rate of children with urgent needs that received a mental health service activity within 3 days of referral to mental health is defined as the percent of children with urgent mental health needs out of all children with urgent needs who received a mental health service within 3 calendar days of referral.
 - (c) Rate of children with routine needs that received a mental health service activity within 30 days of referral to mental health is defined as the percent of children with routine mental health needs out of all children with routine needs who received a mental health service within 30 calendar days of referral.
- (21) Number of children accessing services is defined as the total number of children referred that received a mental health service activity.
 - (a) Number of children with acute needs accessing services is defined as the total number of children with acute needs referred that received a mental health activity.
 - (b) Number of children with urgent needs accessing services is defined as the total number of children with urgent needs referred that received a mental health activity.
 - (c) Number of children with routine needs accessing services is defined as the total number of children with routine needs referred that received a mental health activity.
- (22) Rate of mental health services is defined as the percent of children who receive a mental health service activity out of the total referred.
 - (a) Rate of mental health services of acute screens is defined as the percent of children with acute mental health needs out of the total number of children with acute needs referred who receive a mental health

service activity.

(b) *Rate of mental health services of urgent screens*, is defined as the percent of children with urgent mental health needs out of the total number of children with acute needs referred who receive a mental health service activity.

(c) *Rate of mental health services of routine screens* is defined as the percent of children with routine mental health needs out of the total number of children with acute needs referred who receive a mental health service activity.
