



"I believe in my job. I believe I'm doing the right thing, and it makes me just keep going." Meet Sylvia Lopez, one of our dedicated Children's Social Workers who stand ready to respond to child abuse concerns received through the Child Protection Hotline. During the coronavirus pandemic, Sylvia and our more than 4,000 social workers have not faltered and have remained committed to the safety of LA County's 2 million children.

Over the past three months, the number of calls to the hotline have declined by as much as 50 percent. Under normal circumstances this would be a data point that we would applaud as it would mean that families are stronger and children are safer. Unfortunately, the pandemic has increased social isolation,

stress and economic hardship which increases the probability that some children may experience abuse and/or neglect. That is why we are urging residents to help us spread the word about Prevention & Aftercare Services and the Child Protection Hotline. We all have a role in making our communities stronger & more nurturing places where all children grow up safe.
