



Distance Learning Support For Caregivers and Parents

The implementation of remote learning has presented many challenges in providing quality education support for students and support for caregivers and families.

The Department of Children and Family Services, the Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE), the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD), the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA), and the Los Angeles County Library want you to know there are services available to assist students and their families.

Technology Resources - Devices (tablet, computer, etc.) & hotspots (WiFi access)

- School districts are required to provide devices and hotspots to all of their students. You may need to:
 - Call your school and/or the district
 - Look up your school or district's website for information
 - For caregivers/families that may need assistance with technology (how to use the online learning platform, device issues, etc.), please contact your district's foster youth liaison. Technology assistance may also be found on the district website or the school website.
- The LACOE website includes a list of all 80 school districts and the technology they provide to families.
